[Press Release] Seoul August 30, 2012] BNP Paribas Korea announced that Pierre Rigal, whose work has been supported by the BNP Paribas Foundation, hosted a one-point dance lesson for underprivileged children aged 12~15 from Dong-myung Child Welfare Center and Hae Myeong Boyookwon at LG Art Center yesterday.

As an artist, it is also very rewarding to work with children and to observe their responses to performing arts. I would like to host similar events in other countries where my production is featured."
